Day 1: Friday, September 7, 2018, 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Healthcare Provider Focus

Purpose: Day 1 is designed to target health care providers by providing knowledge about the common medical and psychosocial complications of SCD. Attendees will understand patient-centered approaches to the care of individuals and families living with SCD and become informed on the latest SCD research.

Target Audience: Day 1 will focus on education for health care providers (including nurses, social workers, therapists, pharmacists, physician assistants, physicians and others) and educators, community members, medical and nursing students. Individuals and families with SCD are encouraged to attend both days.

Day 2: Saturday, September 8, 2018, 8:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Family and Individual Focus

Purpose: Day 2 will focus on education for individuals and families living with SCD. Attendees will understand patient-centered approaches to the care of individuals and families living with SCD and become informed on the latest SCD research.

Target Audience: Individuals with SCD, parents, family members, and interested community members who are caregivers for children and adolescents affected by SCD. All health care providers (including nurses, social workers, therapists, pharmacists, physician assistants, physicians, and others), and medical and nursing students.

Note: Childcare and supervised age-appropriate activities will be provided on Day 2 ONLY for children (ages 3 – 10 years old) and adolescents (ages 11 – 14 years old). Space is limited.
